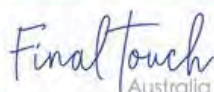

Our Speakers

Dr Maiken Ueland



Maiken Ueland is the Director of The Australian Facility for Taphonomic Experimental Research (AFTER) and an Associate Professor at UTS. She is a leader in the field of forensic taphonomy, where she uses analytical, biochemical, and spectroscopic techniques to conduct human post-mortem investigations.

Dr Ueland's main research areas are human decomposition chemistry with special focus on markers in tissue and odour and their use in criminal investigations, including locating missing persons and estimating time since death. Her interest lies in the interface between forensic science and analytical chemistry.

Her current work focuses on developing methods for the successful location and recovery of victims in mass disaster scenarios using electronic nose technology and sophisticated analytical instrumentation. Dr Ueland also uses her knowledge in odour analysis in the investigation of wildlife crime and conservation.

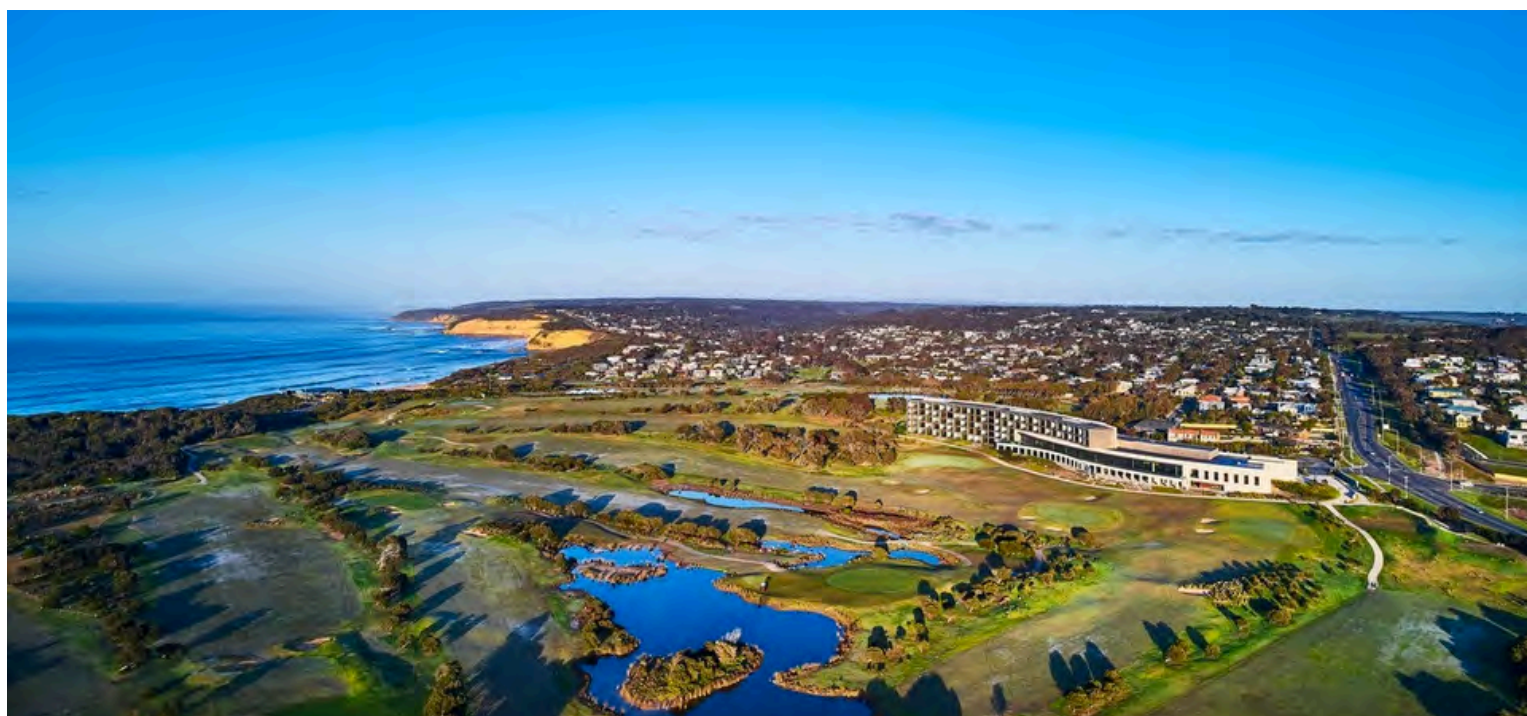

Queenscliff Cemetery

Step back in time as costumed interpreters bring Geelong's history to life, sharing the remarkable stories of notable figures in the very place they rest.

Let hosts **Caroline Newcomb** and **Robert de Bruce Johnstone** introduce you to Reverend **Andrew Love**, Captain **Foster Fyans** and the world's finest actor **Francis Nesbitt**.



Explore the cemetery's rich history and evolution, the development of the final stage, and its unique natural features.

This presentation and walking tour led by **Frank de Groot**, Geelong Cemeteries Trust's *Director of Projects, Development and Innovation*, will take you through the Moonah Walk; a natural burial area recognised for its environmental significance and award-winning design.

Terms and Conditions

The "Tours" relate to the History Alive Tour at Geelong Eastern Cemetery and the Presentation and Walking Tour at Queenscliff Cemetery on Thursday 26 March 2026.

Timing: Each Tour begins at the main entrance of its respective cemetery. Tours run for approximately 60 minutes, although the duration is influenced by attendees' capacity to maintain pace with the tour guide.

Accessibility: These Tours take place within the old sections of the cemeteries, on a range of different and uneven surfaces including grass and gravel, which may have restricted wheelchair access in some pathways. There is a reasonable amount of walking, frequent stops and periods of standing, with no seating available at these stops.

Content: The Tours are suitable for a range of ages, however attendees under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. Some stories shared during the Tours may include themes that could be triggering or emotionally difficult for some attendees.

General: As these Tours are held outdoors, it is recommended to dress for the forecasted weather and if needed, bring your own umbrella. Attendees are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful, responsible and safe manner throughout the Tours.
